

One Caucasus is an interdisciplinary annual festival and a long-term borderland program organized in Georgia (Eurasia) since 2014 in a region of Kvemo Kartli at the border between Armenia and Azerbaijan.

It is an Inspirational & safe space to foster meetings and collaboration of people from the entire Caucasus region and rest of the world.



TSERAKVI



9 YEARS of the FESTIVAL in 2 PARAGRAPHS

In the beginning of every August we go to Tserakvi - "the home of One Caucasus' to start a 3 week pre-festival program. International volunteers from all around the globe arrive to prepare for the festival. They merge into specific teams to accomplish all the tasks required to put on the festival. Musicians coming from Caucasus and beyond gather not just to present their own music but to co-create inter-genre cross national music projects and to lead workshops. The multifunctional One Caucasus Town is created by volunteers, it is designed and built by architects and students of architecture from around the world. This festival space is also known as the "Not-Perfect Town of Our Dreams" and it changes for every edition.

We run interdisciplinary workshops with local citizens (especially youth) who are co-creators of films, animations, exhibitions, and art installations that are all presented also during the festival. Prior festivals also lead to the restoration of the public school building in Tserakvi (our headquarters), repair of some of the roads in the area. The Festival also leads to the implementation of the first participatory budget in the Caucasus. Now One Caucasus architects will contribute to the public space planning in 3 villages in Marneuli. The festival is accessible for all people with its free admission, free living zone and free transport policies.

More than **420** volunteers from **40** countries working in dozens of international task teams,

We made 105 workshop cycles organized by 190+ educators for more than 1580 participants coming from at least 28 villages of Armenian, Azerbaijani, Georgian, Greek and Armenian-Azerbaijani (mixed) ethnicity.

WHY DID WE CHOOSE TSERAKVI TO ORGANIZE ONE CAUCASUS FESTIVAL?

Kvemo-Kartli is a borderland region of Georgia, Armenia, Azerbaijan and is known for being a place where diverse ethnic and religious groups have been living in peace for many years. It is quite unique for the Caucasus which continues to suffer from a range of conflicts and tensions. In this specific area multinational groups of Georgians, Armenians, Azerbaijanis and others have coexisted for centuries.

FESTIVAL of THE NEXT GENERATION

WE ARE NOT JUST **PRESENTING ART,** WE ARE **CREATING IT!** WHAT ELSE ARE WE DOING?

 Creating music projects by bringing together musicians coming from a variety of countries and who represent different genres;
 Building the One Caucasus Town that is unique every year; The town is designed and constructed by architects and students of architecture from around the world;
 - Running educational programs which make local kids cocreators of new movies, animations and other art pieces which are then presented to the festival audiences.





JOINT INTERNATIONAL **MUSIC PROJECTS**RECIPE FOR EXTRAORDINARY, MULTICULTURAL, INTER-GENRE MEAL









One Caucasus brings musicians to the Festival not just to present their own music to the audiences but to work together with other musicians who come from other countries and who represent other genres. You will find fusions of all types of sounds and musical styles: traditional Georgian polyphonic music, Armenian punk-rock, Jamaican gospel, Azerbaijani mugham, American modern jazz, French afro-blues, Nigerian reggae, Senegalese funk, Polish hip-hop, Ukrainian ethnic-ska and many more! Musicians are teamed up for joint rehearsals and for concerts. These rehearsals lead to exciting new projects which are presented for the very first time to the One Caucasus audience on the main stage.

So far 505 musicians and dancers from 75 bands and ensembles have co-created 37 new international music projects during the 8 years of the festival.

Each of 10 music tracks is the result of the joint work of top Georgian musicians Jamaica, USA, Senegal and Nigeria.









Known as the "Not Perfect Town of Our Dreams" the festival is packed with programs of various interdisciplinary activities that occur in a space with informal cinemas, kids zones, bazaars, info-point, camping area, and more.

Volunteers from all over the world come to help with various tasks from promotion and education to construction. Citizens, mostly local youth from nearby villages, become co-creators themselves and produce art projects working together alongside professionals: filmmakers, visual and sound designers, and animators.

WE BELIEVE THE CRAZIEST FESTIVAL CAN INSPIRE TO THE REAL CHANGE.

One Caucasus initiated the first ever **citizen** (**participatory**) budget in the whole of the Caucasus region. Residents of various regions of Georgia can now decide directly on part of their local government spending budgets.

One Caucasus was also the impetus for some of the infrastructure developments in the region (like road renovations and improving water and electricity systems in Tserakvi school and Poladauri scouts camp). In 2019 and 2021 the One Caucasus team took part in renovation of the Tserakvi public school, making it accessible for people in wheelchairs.

One Caucasus has had an impact on the aspirations of local youth, and on raising the skills of these youth from multi-ethnic villages of the region. It has also been a space where young people from divided countries have started to actually work together.

Our home: The public school of Tserakvi has been restored from derelict condition and now even has the potential of becoming an International Education Center (we still have a long way to go).

In 2023 we will continue with participatory space planning in 3 new locations in Bolnisi and Marneuli. We also will continue One Caucasus Creative Education Academy that is aimed to support teachers from multiethnic regions of Georgia.





PARTICIPATING IN A LOCAL **CHANGE**







In 2015 One Caucasus Festival initiated the very first full-scale participatory budget in the Caucasus region and one of the first in the whole post-Soviet period. The Marneuli Municipality assigned 5% of the total local budget (which is actually much more than a standard participatory budget for example in Poland) for projects created by residents and selected by the residents (in meetings that work on consensus). Now the participatory budgets are spreading all over Georgia and the implementation is continuing with the assistance of the Solidarity Fund PL.



LOCAL CHANGE



Two major changes - one in infrastructure (road, water system renovations, school improvements and from this year new public spaces in villages across the region) - change that wouldn't be possible if not leading role of Marneuli municipality, second change is in education - inspiring local kids to be change-makers and artists, providing local teachers with tools for more inclusive, creative and efficient education - One Caucasus continues to be one of the important factors of local change.

ABOVE the **CONFLICT LINES**



I really feel sorry that we are not communicating, these two nations that are so similar, so spiritually - I can say - close to each other.

We have this huge political conflict which keeps us away from each other, that makes us hate each other and when i go back for sure I'm going to tell all my friends that all you know, all you feel, it's bullshit and we should somehow, i don't know how, but we should try think otherwise and be open to overcome this problem."

This festival is not just a meeting place. It is a space where we work together with people from the entire world beyond any possible differences or things that divide people. Everyone coming to support One Caucasus gets to co-create in international teams in music, education, filmmaking, promotion, documentation, architecture or logistics

In the unstable times for Caucasus - we realize that the experience of young Azerbaijanis and Armenians working and performing together - will have a stronger impact than many of the international mediation workshops about conflicts of Caucasus.



SOLIDARITY ACTION TO THE PEOPLE OF MARNEULI AND BOLNISI

To support local multiethnic communities during the first hit of the pandemic, in April 2020 we organized a public awareness action related to COVID19 situation in 2 regions of Kvemo-Kartli.


The video created by 54 people of One Caucasus International Team (including volunteers, architects, educators, musicians) from 17 countries from all over the world included concrete recommendations on how to protect yourself from contracting COVID. The video was available in 5 languages (Azeri, Armenian, Georgia, Russian and English) and was retransmitted by 2 Georgian national TV channels.

VACCINATION MARATHON & OC MOBILE

Working in Georgia in time of the most tragic wave of pandemic (2021) we decided to dedicate our efforts to supporting the vaccination process for local multiethnic communities in villages distanced from regional centers. In partnership with the Georgia's National Center for Disease Control (NCDC), and with the motto "If you cannot visit the home of music, music will visit your home" we visited 6 villages of Marneuli (Sadakhlo, Kizilajlo, Tserakvi, Sioni, Shulaveri, Khojorni) and 2 in Dmanisi (Amamlo, Bezaglo) with the OC mobile (a live music platform) and the vaccination van provided by the NCDC (with doctors and vaccines). In four action days we managed to successfully outreach to locals and provide for 200+ people an onspot vaccination.
